FIFTY YEARS AGO, Coos Curry Douglas Economic Improvement Association (CCDEIA) was formed. In 1971, the U.S. Economic Development Administration and the three counties (Coos, Curry, and Douglas) founded CCDEIA to find relief from "chronic and persistent unemployment."

In 1981, CCDEIA was renamed to CCD Business Development Corporation to better reflect the work that the organization had been doing for years.

Now in 2021, 50 years later, CCD continues to support local businesses through various small business financing options, lead the region in community and economic development, and build partner relationships with the many organizations doing great work in our region.

1971	June 1, 1971 Coos Curry Douglas Economic Improvement Association opens doors in Roseburg, OR.
1972	CCDEIA designated as an Economic Development District by the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA)
1978	EDA Revolving Loan Fund established.
1981	CCD receives 501c3 status and becomes Oregon's first "Certified Development Company", designated by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) to package SBA 503's (now SBA 504 Loan Program).
1983	CCD opens its 2nd office location in North Bend.
1984	CCD is contracted to administer the City of Drain's Revolving Loan Fund.



In 1981, CCD Business Development Corporation was licensed by the Small Business Administration (SBA) as a Certified Development Company (CDC). In February of 1982, CCD received it's official recognition as a 503 loan corporation. CCD was the first Oregon organization to receive the federal designation, allowing CCD to finance development projects of up to \$1 million.

In July of that same year, CCD opened up a second location in North Bend, Oregon. With the new location, a revolving loan fund, and access to federal Small Business Administration loan funds, CCD was well-positioned to meet the influx of small business loan requests that were coming in. From 1981-1982, CCD committed about \$5.7 million in business loans.

Five decades later, CCD continues to provide business clients with loans, loan packaging and additional forms of management consulting for startups, acquisitions and expansion.

To date, CCD has deployed \$157,853,895 in direct funding to small businesses through our Revolving Loan Funds and the SBA 504 Program.

in Community Development

In 1972, CCD was designated the Economic Development District for Coos, Curry, and Douglas Counties by the Economic Development Administration (EDA). Within this role, CCD is responsible for identifying priority economic development needs within the region and assisting local governments in applying for grant funding through the EDA and other funding sources.

The origins of the corporation focused heavily on obtaining grants and funding for projects in all three counties. The grants focused on job retention and infrastructure development. CCD performs many of the initial needs and issues studies needed to obtain grants for economic development.

CCD remains very active in the counties' economic development processes and offers staff services to many rural communities in grant writing and management.

Every five years, under EDA's guidance, CCD and the region assemble a Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) alongside a number of different people, businesses, city officials and more.

Today, CCD's Community Development
Department is involved in many types of
economic development projects and ideas.
CCD is always looking for ways to expand
what we do for our communities. CCD is the
Enterprise Zone Manager for all 10
Enterprise Zones in our region. CCD has
many partners and we take pride in working
together. CCD looks forward to continuing
to grow the region for decades to come!
